Aims of this report:

All schools with Secondary aged pupils who have not reached the expected standard in reading and maths at the end of KS2 are allocated grant funding to support them in Year 7. At Clarendon, this applies to all year 7 pupils. Schools are required to publish details of their allocation for the current financial year and how it will be spent, as well as the allocation, how it was spent and the impact of work undertaken as a result of the funding for the previous financial year. This report aims to fulfil this requirement. It will be updated termly to provide evidence of how we are using the funding to secure maximum sustainable impact.

How we intend to spend this year's allocation:

Intervention	Allocation (total: £7412)
1 Kick mentor based around sport and dance. 5 pupils seen weekly, with lunch and afterschool club also offered	£7600

Additional 4 x 45 minute lessons weekly by qualified teacher to provide targeted individual and small group teaching of Year 7 pupils in English, and 5 x 45 lessons weekly for maths.	£9883	Additional maths teaching directly led to an average maths attainment improvement of 1.5 months over previous year's results (average progress 9.3 months, up from 7.8 months in previous year). Additional English teaching helped secure upper quartile progress in writing for 22/24 pupils (91.6%).	Annual standardised testing (MALT test). Teacher assessment in writing, using Clarendon Flight Path for target setting.
