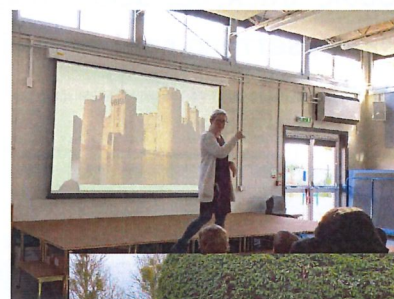
### End of Spring Term

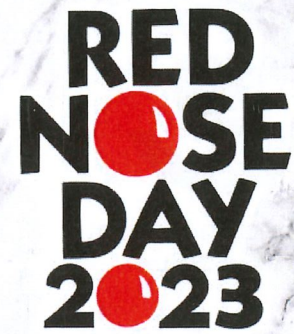


## Comic Relief

Thank you to all the pupils, parents and staff who ensured that everyone had fun on Red Nose Day, raising £51.

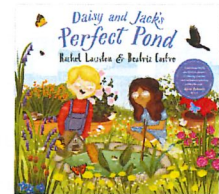


Pupils enjoyed dressing up and doing themed literacy and PSHE activities and sharing their favourite stories.
