The last seven weeks have flown by and we hope you enjoyed seeing all the learning and fun that your children have done




this half term. Pupils have explored and learnt within a wide context of activities, including many enriched outdoor learning opportunities. This week Comet class went to Holly Lodge

for an autumn and seasonal change workshop and sensory walk.


We would all like to say a huge thank you to Mark, our Forest School Leader, who retired this week. Mark has
