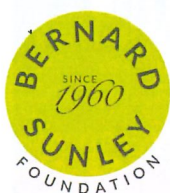

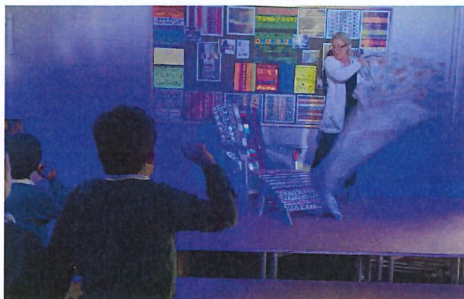
### Art Workshop... with a quote from Maisy's mum...
