
Did you know it took us almost two weeks to grow mould on cheap white bread? It makes you wonder what chemicals are stopping the process!

Finally, we have special praise for Katie Emmett who produced amazing sensory art work as in her snail panel shown.


Again we are so very proud of our students efforts and commitment to both subjects.

Enrichment News


