Maths has been another area of focus, and we have invested heavily in the introduction of a new "maths mastery" programme, which is based on the latest educational research on how pupils learn and retain concepts best.

Looking ahead to the summer term, there is much to look forward to. On the first week back our intrepid Y11 pupils will be embarking on work experience placements out in the community. This will be a valuable opportunity for our pupils to develop vital skills for the world of work, and prepare them for adulthood and college next year. Later in the term, exam season will start for our KS4 learners. 








#### 9M SHAKESPEARE'S GLOBE THEATRE










### 10P WORLD BOOK DAY




#### **CREATIVE ARTS: MUSIC**


