

English	Maths	PSHE
<p>For those pupils who have reached phase 5 phonics using the Little Wandle scheme, we continue to 'Grow the Code' learning the alternative GPCs for different phonemes. This is slightly different now as we are using the Little Wandle reading books to develop our vocabulary and comprehension, alongside developing our phonic knowledge.</p> <p>For pupils working at phase 2 we will continue following the Little Wandle progression to support learning.</p> <p>The story we will be looking closely at this half term is the day the crayons quit. This is a lovely story featuring a little boy called Duncan. Duncan loves to colour, but when he opens his box of crayons, he finds only letters, all saying the same thing: The crayons are cross and annoyed with the way that Duncan treats them and his crayons have quit! Purple Crayon is annoyed with Duncan for colouring outside the lines, Pink Crayon wants to be used to draw dinosaurs and monsters and White Crayon feels invisible. We will be exploring feelings and how our behaviour influences the feelings of others.</p>  <p>As part of this we will be continuing with the concept of writing to inform and again we will be continuing to work on using capital letters, full stops and describing words (Using colourful semantics the children know these as purple words).</p>	<p>We will be continuing the NCETM Mastering Number project. We will use this scheme to plan our maths.</p> <p>In addition, we will be exploring shape space and measure. The children will be introduced to a variety of different measurements, cm, m, mm, l, cl, g, kgs.</p>	<p>This half term our PSHE is exploring the topic of self awareness and readiness to listen, learn and take part. Having already looked at the PANTS rules from the NSPCC earlier this year, we will revisit the topic, remembering that our bodies are private.</p>
Understanding The World	Science	Computing and Music
<p>In UTW this half term we will be looking at the Human and physical geography of our local area. Human and physical geography is all about the things that we can see around us. Physical features like seas, mountains and rivers are natural. They would be here even if there were no people, and human features consist of houses, roads and bridges. (manmade)</p> <p>As always we will be having a closer look at the changing season and the different types of weather that the summer months are providing us with.</p>	<p>For science this half term the children will be taking a closer look at plants and following on from planting our own beans and seeds last half term we will be encouraging the children to care for their plants and watch them grow. We will be spending time in our sensory garden tending to all the vegetables and herbs that we have already planted and if the weather brightens up then we may even be able to sample the fruits of our labour. Science links nicely with our art this half term as Marc Quinn has an insulation at Kew gardens which he has designed and created 3D sculptures of a variety of different things including flowers and plants. The children will also be linking science with UTW and having an indepth look at the new session change that is happening around us.</p>	<p><b>Computing</b> In computing this half term we will be revisiting programming, coding and algorithms. The children will be given lots of opportunities to program a variety of different computing equipment that we have in school, for example remote control cars, beebots, blue beebots. The children will be having a go at writing their own code for themselves and others to follow when programming the beebots.</p> <p><b>Music</b> Music is all about Tempo this half term the children will be exploring fast and slow sounds. We will be listening to a variety of different music styles (pop, dance, country, classical, jazz, blues and rick) as part of this the children will be tasked with identifying the tempo that they can hear. We will be discussing our likes and dislikes of music and looking at how our musical tastes change as we get older.</p>
