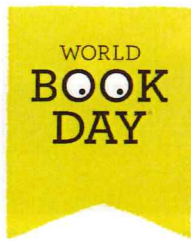
Junior Citizen Scheme

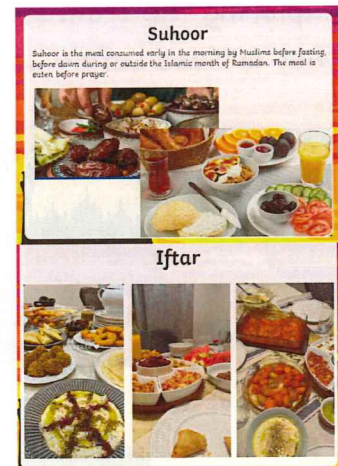


A huge well done to Angela and her daughter who completed the Bath 50 Ultra Challenge last weekend, raising over £1,000 for the Brain Tumour Charity.



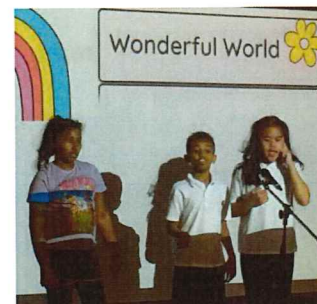
School Assemblies
