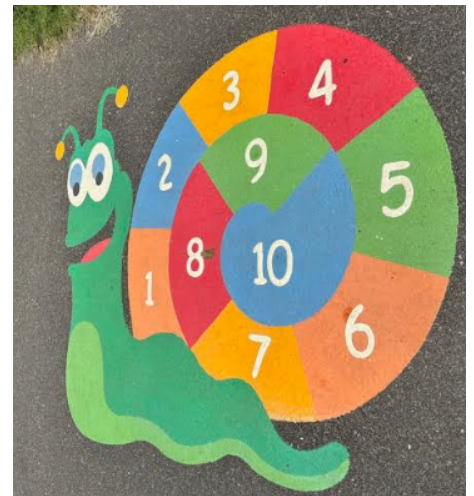

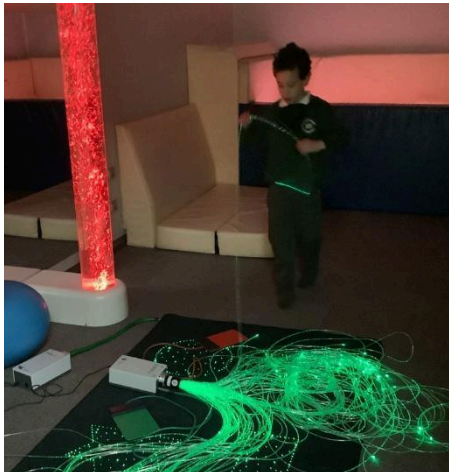

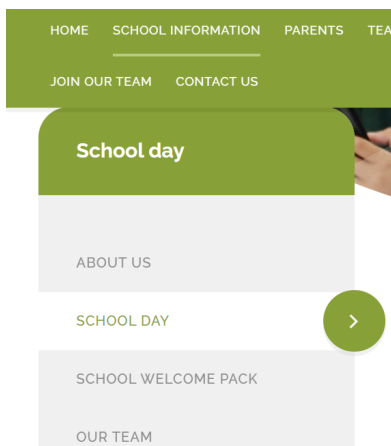

If your child comes to school on transport, a member of staff greets them from their minibus or taxi when they arrive. Please make sure that your child is at school for 8.50am and collected at the end of the day at 3.00pm. Please can you ensure that you are on time to collect your child, as it can be very upsetting for a child if they are the last one left at the end of the day. The children must be collected by an adult. If someone else will be collecting your child, please let the office know.

Documentation

Please ensure that all forms you have been given by the school are completed and returned before your child starts in September. It is vital that we have all the information we need to ensure that your child is safe and happy. We need up to date contact details (including emergency contacts), medical information and photography permissions. We also need to know who will be collecting your child from school (family or transport). If there are any changes then please notify us immediately.

Class Kit

In Comets class children learn in the classroom and in the outside learning environment, for example, when they go to Forest School. Consequently, pupils need equipment for learning inside and outside in all weathers. Pupils will need any items required for personal care if required.

Your child will need a small bag which will go between home and school each day. We do not offer school book bags or PE bags. We ask that

children **do not** bring large bags, e.g. backpacks, into school as we do not have space to store these in class.



Home - school communication.

Your child will have a home school diary in their book bag and any letters to you from the school will also be put in the bag. Please check the home school diary daily for any important information. Please also use this book to let us know information about your child.

We have weekly news sessions and conversation groups where details about what they have been up to, what they are into and how they are, are vitally important.

Reading books

Your child will bring home a reading book each week. This book typically is a familiar book, linked to your child's phonics level (from Little Wandle) and will be a book that they have previously read in class. Please return this book to school to be changed weekly.

Curriculum & Teaching

Comets' curriculum is broadly based on the National Curriculum and is differentiated according to the needs of our pupils, with a strong focus on English, maths and life skills. Students are taught in a variety of ways to maximise their potential. There are new topics every half term within the school, differentiated for each class and which serve as the theme for pupils' learning. Daily reading to an adult occurs first thing in the morning before breakfast and this is an opportunity for staff to talk with students individually to gauge how they are feeling and to support them with any worries or concerns. Long and medium term plans can be found on our website.

Forest School

Every week, Comets Class has Forest School. Sometimes this is on the school site but more often out and about exploring different environments and participating in Forest School activities and games which embrace the whole curriculum.

In class we have waterproof coats and trousers, but you will need to supply a pair of clearly named wellingtons to be kept in school for those wet or muddy days. On Forest School days students can wear tracksuits or other suitable clothing for exploring in the woods.

Swimming

At some point during the academic year Comets class will have swimming lessons. Children will need a full swimming kit and towel each week to attend. This gives the children an opportunity to become more confident around water and learn aspects of water safety.

Routines

The children begin each morning by reading and then playing outdoors. At 9:15 the school meets for breakfast, followed by a school assembly. The students will have maths and English-based activities in the morning and cross-curricular activities in the afternoons. In addition, children have weekly yoga sessions and PE, as well as music and drama.

Dropping Off and Collecting Your Child

If your child comes to school on transport, they will independently go to their classroom, hang up coats or bags and take any mobile devices or letters to the office. If you bring your child to school, the main entrance will be open from 8.30 until 8.50

and then again at 15.00. Please make sure you arrive on time. It can be very upsetting for a child if they miss the start of the day or are the last one left at the end of the day. The children must be collected by an adult. If someone else will be collecting your child, please let Comets class staff know or call the office.

Illness and Absences

Children who become ill during the school day are looked after by Comets Staff and if necessary, parents will be contacted and asked to collect their child. It is very important that we have an up-to-date contact telephone number on which we can contact you during the school day.

To avoid the spread of viruses, please do not bring your child to school if they are feeling unwell. If your child has sickness or diarrhoea, they cannot come into school until 48 hours after the last bout. Please telephone the school office if your child is going to be absent. Please note, absences will only be authorised for reasons such as illness or genuine family emergencies. We strongly recommend you do not take your child on holiday during term time, as this can be very disruptive to their learning and friendships. Term time holidays will not be authorised.

Food and Drink

We have sinks in each classroom from which drinking water is available. Each child needs to bring a named refillable water bottle. Fruit, toast, cereal, porridge, water and milk will be provided for the children at breakfast time. We recommend all children eat our healthy school lunches. However, if you would prefer your child to bring a packed lunch, we would like you to support our Packed Lunch Policy. We do not allow sweets, glass bottles, fizzy drinks or cans in packed lunches.

We are a **NUT FREE** school. We have children and staff who have allergies to nuts and who could be seriously ill if they come into contact with these. Please do not send any nut products into school or include oranges in lunch boxes.

Uniform

The school has a uniform policy, which all children are required to follow. Most uniform items can be purchased locally from stores and supermarkets. The only item with the school logo on is our school jumper. We do have a limited stock at school that can be purchased from the school office or alternatively ordered online through our stockist Stitch Design. Details can be found on our website under the parents section. A uniform list is enclosed in your welcome pack and can also be found on the

school website. Please ensure that every item is clearly named. Please ensure your child brings a waterproof coat into school every day.

Jack the dog



Jack is a friendly cocker spaniel and also our school dog. He visits classes to see all of the children and staff at Clarendon Primary. He also enjoys some playtime spending time with the pupils and staff. Jack is training as a school therapy dog and helps to support the pupils, improve self-esteem, regulate and calm and develop empathy and emotional literacy. He has also helped children to overcome their fear of dogs and learn how to behave around dogs in the environment.

Queries or Concerns

At Clarendon, we have an open door policy. You can talk to Comets class teachers if there are any concerns. If there are urgent issues, then please ask at the office and one of us will make ourselves available to you as soon as we can. If you feel you need more time, you are welcome to arrange an appointment with your child's teacher. Once a term, you will have a chance to meet with the staff to discuss the progress of your child. Dates of these meetings will be given to you in advance and can be found on the school website.

Information

The curriculum overview and mid term planning can be found on the school website. The school has a texting and emailing service (Parent mail) and will contact you with reminders and information.

Specialist Therapy Team

At Clarendon Primary Centre we have Speech and Language Therapists, Occupational Therapists, Physiotherapists, an Educational Psychologist and Counsellors who will work alongside the teaching teams as required to support individual students and classes. We also offer 'Family Group' to Clarendon Primary Centre families. Our Family Partnership Worker is available to speak with parents and to provide support. Please contact the school office.

Special Occasions

We like to celebrate the children's birthdays, as it is an important time for them and it makes them feel very special. We know that some parents like to bring something in for the class to share to celebrate their child's birthday. We also celebrate festivals and special days, as this helps the children gain an understanding of the different cultures and religions in our community. Parents are welcome to contribute ideas for activities and any information on festivals they celebrate.
