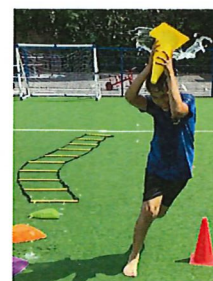


sharing the final showcase to the other pupils in school during a celebration assembly. A recording will be available to everyone on our website.
