who volunteered to do training during the Christmas holidays to run the asymptomatic Covid testing conducted twice a week.



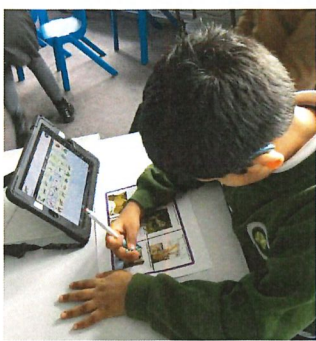
...we continue to say our prayers for your safety and are so pleased that staff are getting their vaccine.
