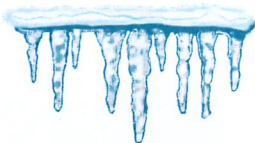
school and those currently at home.

Jamie, one of our year 6 pupils, has proudly taken on the responsibility for helping with the laptop and projector during assemblies.

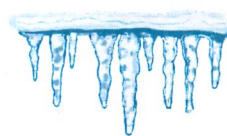

During the current Covid pandemic, within our risk assessment we continue to ensure that windows and doors are always open, with many outdoor learning opportunities for pupils, as the outdoors is a safer environment.

Pupils really enjoy seeing what happens to water overnight and exploring the ice when they come to school in the morning.

They share a rich range of vocabulary, expressing their excitement and describing the ice. One of our year 4 pupils, who has recently learnt about how light travels through materials, was delighted to show his teacher how his piece was transparent.
