



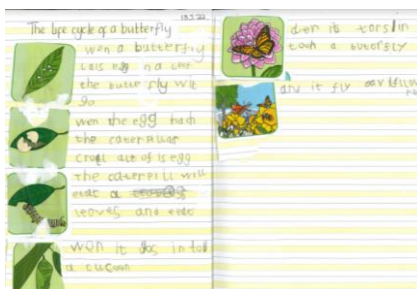

Primary half term theme exploring 'How does it start'

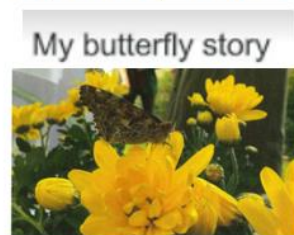
