<p>In T4W we will be focusing on the book <i>The Radiant Child</i> by Javaka Steptoe</p>  <p>Jean-Michel Basquiat and his unique, collage-style paintings rocketed to fame in the 1980s as a cultural phenomenon unlike anything the art world had ever seen. However, before that, he was a little boy who saw art everywhere: in poetry books and museums, in games, in the words that we speak and in the pulsing energy of New York City. Now, award-winning illustrator Javaka Steptoe's vivid text and bold artwork echoing Basquiat's own style introduces young readers to the powerful message that art doesn't always have to be neat or clean - and definitely not inside the lines - to be beautiful.</p> <p>As a class we will be writing questions to the artist making sure to use the correct punctuation, tenses and prefixes - un High frequency words</p> <p>As a class we will also be writing to inform in a variety of different ways. 	<p>This half term is all about plants! The overarching topic for this half term is chips and dips. We will be having a go at making a variety of different dips (Humus, Thousand Island, Tzatziki, to name a few.)
