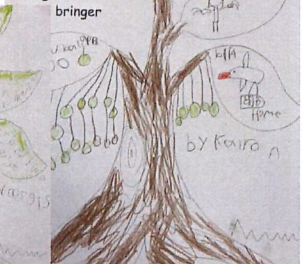
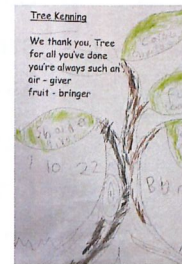

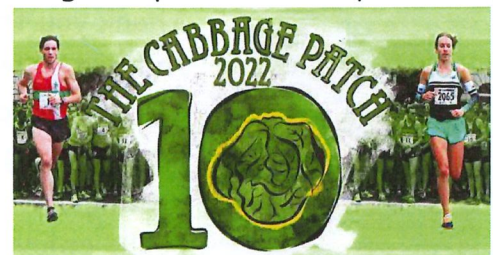
Celebrating staff achievements and fund raising
